- 6. Answer the question, "Which month are we in?

Warm-Up (5 minutes)	 Song: Sing the "Days of the Week" song (e.g., to the tune of "The Addams Family"): 'J' "Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday!" Quick Question: Ask students, "What day is it today?" Write their answers on the board 	 Song: Sing a months of the year song (e.g., to the tune of "Ten Little Indians"): J: "January, February, March and April, May, June, July and August" J: Quick Question: Ask, "Which month are we in?
2.Introductio n (10 minutes)	 Activity 1: Introducing the Days Show flashcards of the days of the week in order. Say each day aloud and ask students to repeat after you. Activity 2: Calendar Exploration Point to a weekly calendar and highlight each day as you say it. Ask: "What comes after Monday? What comes before Wednesday?" 	 Activity 1: Introducing the Months Show flashcards of the months in order. Say each month aloud and ask students to repeat after you. Activity 2: Calendar Exploration Point to a yearly calendar and highlight the current month. Ask: "What month comes after January? What month comes before March?"
3. Guided Practice (15 minutes)	 Activity 3: Sequencing Game Mix up the flashcards and have students place them in the correct order. Ask: "Which day comes next?" 	 Activity 3: Sequencing Game Mix up the flashcards and have students place them in the correct order. Ask: "Which month comes next?" Activity 4: Sentence Practice
	Activity 4: Sentence PracticeWrite on the board:	 Write on the board: "This month is" "Next month is"

	 "Today is" "Yesterday was" "Tomorrow will be" Model sentences and have students practice filling in the blanks: Teacher: "Today is Monday. Yesterday was" Students: "Sunday!" 	 "Last month was <u></u>." Model sentences and have students practice: Teacher: "This month is June. Next month is <u></u>." Students: "July!"
4. Independent Practice (10 minutes)	 Activity 5: Worksheet Activity Provide a worksheet with: Days of the week to place in the correct order. Fill-in-the-blank sentences: "Today isTomorrow will be" 	 Activity 5: Worksheet Activity Activity 5: Worksheet Activity Provide a worksheet with: Months of the year to place in the correct order. Fill-in-the-blank sentences: "This month is Next month is"
5. Wrap-Up and Assessment (5 minutes)	 Activity 6: Recap Game Ask students, "What day is it today?" Have them respond in complete sentences: "Today is" Exit Ticket: Each student says one sentence about the day (e.g., "Today is Tuesday"). 	 Activity 6: Quick Recap Game Ask students, "Which month are we in?" Have them respond in complete sentences: "This month is" Exit Ticket: Each student says one sentence about the current month.
