Language and Literacy Key Focus Areas: • Listening Skills:

- Introducing sounds and rhythms
- through rhymes and songs.
 Following simple instructions in classroom activities.

Speaking Skills:

- Encouraging children to use short sentences, like "May I have water?" or "I like apples."
- Story retelling: Asking kids to recall parts of a story.
 Reading Skills:

- Recognizing uppercase and lowercase letters.
- Simple sight words like "and," "the,"
 "cat."

Writing Skills:

- Holding pencils correctly.
- Tracing and copying shapes, letters, and simple words.

• Alphabet: Learning letters (A–Z).

- Colors: Red, blue, green, yellow, etc.
- Numbers: One to ten, and beyond.
- Simple Verbs: Run, jump, eat, drink, play, sit, stand.
 - Opposites: Big/small, up/down, happy/sad.
- Common Nouns: Animals, fruits, family members, objects in the classroom.
- Pronouns: I, you, he, she, we, they.
- Prepositions: In, on, under, near, far.

Mathematics Key Focus Areas:

- Number Recognition and Counting:
 - Numbers 1–20 (progressing to 50 if applicable).
 - Counting real-world objects like toys, crayons, or snacks.
- Shapes and Patterns:
 - İdentifying shapes in daily surroundings (e.g., a clock is a circle).
 - Simple patterns: Red-blue-red or ABC-ABC sequences.
- Introduction to Measurement:
 - Exploring concepts of length (short/long) and weight (light/heavy)

Science and Exploration Key Focus Areas:

Nature and Environment:

- Teaching seasons, weather, and the importance of plants and trees.
- The Human Body:
 - Identifying body parts and their basic functions.
- Simple Experiments:
 - Planting a seed and observing its growth.
 - Exploring floating versus sinking objects in water.

Key Focus Areas:

- Community and Helpers:
 - Introducing firefighters, doctors, police officers, and teachers.
 - Emphasizing their roles through stories or role-play.
- Basic Geography:
 - Identifying their city, state, and country.
 - Learning the concept of home and school.

 - Saying "please" and "thank you."
 - Practicing taking turns and sharing.
